GAB releases fish into Sungai Way

PETALING JAYA: GAB Foundation celebrated World Water Day last Saturday by releasing three fish species into Sungai Way river.

Over the past three years, GAB Foundation through its WATER (Working Actively Through Education and Rehabilitation) Project had worked closely with a non-governmental organisation — the Global Environment Centre, the community and government agencies to improve the water quality of Sungai Way river. Today, the river which once had a Class IV-V water quality rating (extremely polluted) is now classified as Class III (suitable for living organisms).

Members of the public and children of Guinness Anchor Bhd employees turned up in full force to join GAB Foundation trustee and Guinness Anchor managing director Charles Ireland to release the 30 fish which included the catfish, snakeheads and climbing perch into the river.

Ireland said, "We hope through the releasing of the fish, we are sending out a strong message that with the involvement of the community and government agencies, we can have clean rivers where fish are able to thrive in."

The foundation also organised a "World Water Day" mini carnival for employees of Guinness Anchor at the Foundation's WATER Project River Cabin in Taman Desa Ria, here.
